

INDICTMENT

July 2021 TERM - at Norfolk, Virginia

THE GRAND JURY CHARGES THAT:

COUNT ONE

(Transfer of a Firearm in Violation of the National Firearms Act)

On or about February 11, 2021, in Virginia Beach, in the Eastern District of Virginia, the defendants, JHAIMEEK KERION CARTER and TYEREIS SMITH, aided and abetted by each other, did unlawfully transfer a firearm, to wit: a Bay State 12 gauge short barrel shotgun, in violation of the provisions of the National Firearms Act.

(In violation of Title 26, United States Code, 5812, 5845, 5861(e) and Title 18, United States Code, Section 2).

CRIMINAL FORFEITURE

THE GRAND JURY FINDS PROBABLE CAUSE THAT:

- 1. The defendants, JHAIMEEK KERION CARTER and TYEREIS SMITH, if convicted of the violation alleged in this Indictment, shall forfeit to the United States, as part of the sentencing pursuant to Federal Rule of Criminal Procedure 32.2, any firearm or ammunition used in or involved the violation.
- If any property that is subject to forfeiture above is not available, it is the intention of the United States to seek an order forfeiting substitute assets pursuant to Title 21, United States Code, Section 853 and Federal Rule of Criminal Procedure 32.2(e).

(In accordance with 18 U.S.C. § 924(d); 26 U.S.C. § 5872; and 28 U.S.C. § 2461(c)).
