Trooper [redacted] was in uniform displaying badge of authority, operating a marked patrol vehicle when I observed a black Kia Stinger traveling Interstate 64 Eastbound at the 256 Mile Marker in the right lane. I got behind the vehicle and confirmed it was the correct vehicle, a Black Kia Stinger with the Virginia registration of [redacted].

Trooper [redacted] activated his lights and siren to attempt to stop the vehicle, due to it being the exact vehicle that eluded law enforcement less than 10 minutes prior. The vehicle then continued failing to yield to blue emergency lights and audible siren.

After many attempts to stop the vehicle, both the vehicles crashed and Trooper [redacted] took the driver, [redacted] identified as [redacted] in custody. An impound inventory was conducted on the Kia and the Passport and identification for Hector Olmeda Jr were in the vehicle. Three cell phones were also observed in the vehicle. Police believe one of the cell phones to be that of Mr. Olmeda due to his identity being in the vehicle.

There were no outstanding warrants at the time of the pursuit for Mr. [redacted] to give him a reason to flee.

Mr. Hector Olmeda Jr is an active missing person from Portsmouth who lived with Mr. [redacted] at [redacted] Wilcox Ave and has not been heard from since afternoon of 2/27/24, by way of text messages to his mother out of state, or his juvenile daughter who he contacted at least once a day every day. Noone has had contact since 2/27/24 which is very out of the ordinary.

Based on results of the search warrant for the Kia Stinger vehicle registered to [redacted] Detectives located the following items: a wallet belonging to Hector E Olmeda Jr. identified by his CA identification seen through a clear sleeve inside the wallet, a Passport with the name of Hector E Olmeda, A NFCU bank card belonging to Mr. Olmeda in the console, and another NFCU bank card belonging to Mr. Olmeda in a wallet belonging to [redacted] identified by his identification card. 

While searching for belongings for the victim, journals (hard bound composition notebooks) were discovered that could show the state of mind that \_\_\_\_\_ was in and show insight to his mental condition.

\_\_\_\_\_ currently at Eastern State Hospital for comments made to Hampton Jail Employees in reference to wanting to kill himself. Police further believe that the computers, tablets, and internet router that are in the home will further show \_\_\_\_\_ motive and shed light on the physical evidence found in the home.
